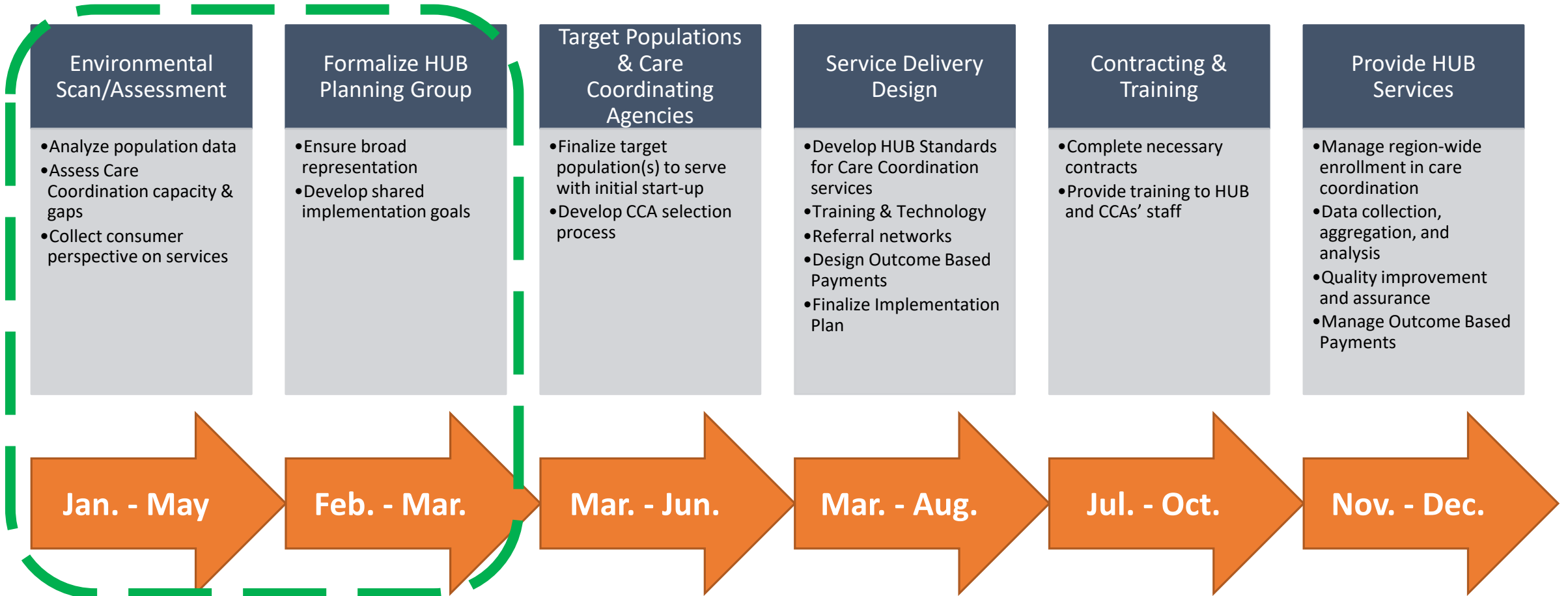

Review assessment plans

- Population analysis
 - Now through February
 - County level data for potential target populations
- Care Coordination Capacity environmental scan
 - Now through March
 - Detailed assessment of services, case loads, financial models, referrals, reporting, and interest in the Pathways model

NOTE: Other MTD projects have additional assessment work in development

Feedback on Assessment Plans

- Population analysis
 - How to define high risk pregnancy
 - Limited data for homeless, and EMS utilizer populations
- Input on capacity assessment questions
 - Model & Services: 4
 - Care Coordinators: 1, 9, 10
 - Financial: all
- General feedback

Process for finalizing Target Population(s) and selecting CCAs

Implementation Goals:

- Select up to six CCAs by mid 2018
- Complete CCA training and begin HUB services by end of 2018
- Produce population health outcomes that can be measured and packaged for purchase by HUB Payers
- Increase case loads and number of CCAs to reach over 4,000 people by 2021

Proposed Process:

- Analyze population & capacity data
- Recommend target population(s) to CPAA Council by May
- Open RFP process for agencies to serve target population(s) as CCAs
- Recommend up to six CCAs to CPAA Council by June

Considerations

- Population needs
- Health Equity
- Value for HUB payers
- Existing capacity
- Time constraint of Medicaid Transformation
- Potential to impact population over time
- Synergies with other projects (e.g. Community Paramedicine, Home Visiting, etc.)
