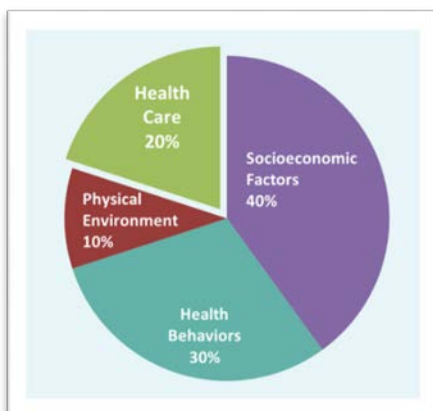

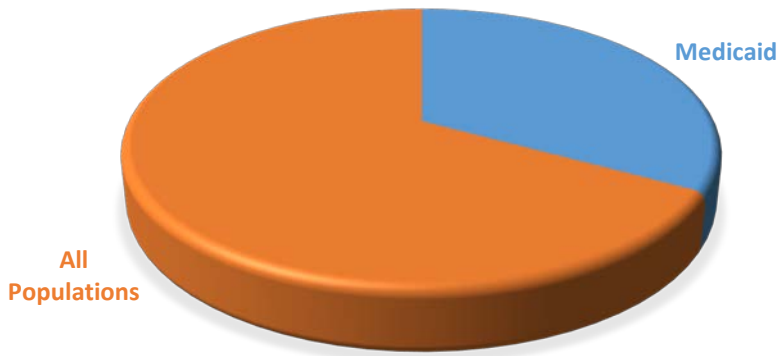

Governance

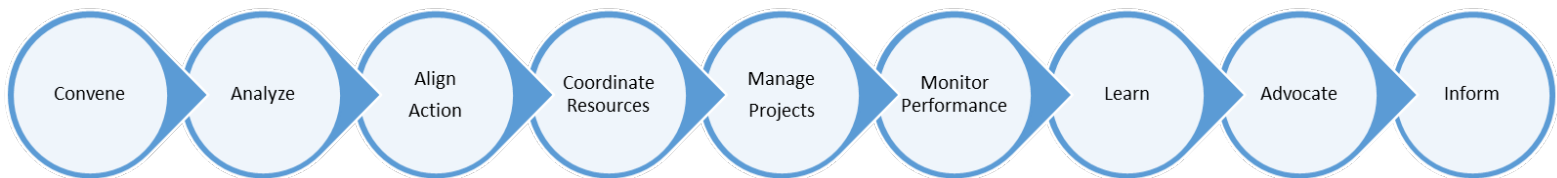
Cascade Pacific Action Alliance (CPAA) is organized as a single-member LLC with a 19-member **Board of Directors** that reflects a diversity of community and clinical sectors. A broad-based regional **Coordinating Council** with representation from seven local **Community Forums**, one in each participating county, and regional and state partners advises the board. The board receives additional input from:

- Project **Work Groups**, subject matter experts and representatives from CPAA partnering providers;
- The **Support Team**, which includes chairs of all work groups to ensure projects complement each other and strategies align across the region;
- A **Consumer Advisory Committee**, comprised of community members and Medicaid beneficiaries with a wide range of backgrounds and lived experiences of health disparities to balance clinical considerations and ensure projects are responsive to consumer needs; and
- A **Clinical Provider Committee**, made up of different clinical provider types to ensure clinical oversight and assess project feasibility and workforce and value-based purchasing implications from a provider perspective.
